

DVD-R/RW, DVD+R/RW

DVD discs are programmed with region numbers indicating countries in which they can played. The region number of this unit is 1. If the DVD disc is marked with a different region number, it cannot be played

DVD-R and DVD-RW discs must be made in Video DVD mode. DVD+RW discs

must be made in accordance with the specifications for DVD+RW disc with a 4.7 GB capacity. Video CD (VCD), Super Video CD (SVCD)

Audio CDs CD-R/RW

This player can play most CD-R/RW discs. However depending on the recording conditions, you may find that not all discs will play successfully.

If no center speaker is present, the decoder splits the center signals equally to the left and right speakers to create a "phantom" center image. The Center Width allows variable adjustment of the center image so it may be heard only from the center speaker; only from the left/right speakers as a phantom image; or from all three front speakers to varying degrees.
